#### Title:

- 1. Titles should be capitalized
- 2. Should not exceed 20 words;
- 3. Centered Font 12 bold Times New Roman

#### Author

- 1. Full name without title;
- 2. There should be a comma between authors.

### Affiliation

12 point type, centered, italicized

#### **Abstract format:**

1. Text should be written in word (doc. or docx.), Times New Roman 12 pts;

- 2. Line Spacing- 1.15;
- 3. List of 3 5 keywords or phrases in alphabetical order, separated by semicolon (but you must write down one keyword per line in the online submission system).

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4. Should not exceed <del>\$50 words</del>. 250 words

#### Abstract content:

- 1. Introductory statement that outlines the background and significance of the Study;
- 2. Brief description of the basic methodologies;
- 3. Clear indication of the major findings of the study;
- 4. Concluding statement.

*Purpose:* The Purpose part shall include a clear description of the study background, the specific purposes, questions addressed, and/or hypotheses tested (if any).

*Method*: The Method section must describe the study design (qualitative, quantitative, multi and/or mixed methods) and general procedures including characteristics and numbers of participants and or interviewee (if any) and data collection methods. If the study does not involve primary data collection, information should be provided on the methods used to summarize previously reported data (e.g., narrative or systematic review, meta-analysis).

*Results:* The Results section summarizes findings referred to the stated purposes of the article.

*Conclusion:* The Conclusions section shall state specifically the extent to which the stated purposes of the article have been met or/and the potential implications (theoretical and/or clinical) of the findings.

*Recommendation*: The recommendation shall give a solution to overcome problem identification stated above.

Keywords: 3-5 phrases or words separated by semicolon.
